It is so easy to love those who are kind to us, who love us in return, yes? And it's a real stinker of a task to love someone who is down right detestable and disgruntled with the world in general... would you also agree?

I recently had the unfortunate opportunity (or so I thought) to cross paths with one such individual. No matter how much finesse I used to communicate what I needed to discuss with this person...my efforts were futile. I exited the conversation I was having with this person *abruptly* to prevent myself from saying something I knew I would regret! Afterward, my whole morning was shot and I felt like a

I listened as she told me how long she had been praying about this decision and even though she was not sure how her family was going to survive her not working a full time job, she

knew this was exactly what God wanted her to do. She trusted God and was choosing to move forward even though she was unsure of her future financially. She knew God would provide.

The confidence and assurance that she radiated as she spoke of her plans, blessed my heart, and with tears in my eyes...I told her so. Without a moment's hesitation she reached her hands through my window, her fingers spread wide for me to reach forward and grasp. As I slipped my fingers between hers I felt a surge of positive energy pulse through my body as she looked me straight in the eye and told me *that I was a blessing to her, too!*

The second woman was in her late thirties and required assistance from a care service provider.
